

Given that only 10 had to be selected, the selection rate was less than 1% of the applications. Atul Satija, founder of N/Core, said some of the best business schools in the world do not have such a rate, and that it indicated an increasing

inflow of highly talented and motivated entrepreneurs to solve for poverty in India. Of the 1,032 applicants, 330 submitted proper business plans. Based on these plans, 50 were shortlisted. There were telephonic interviews with these 50, and based on their depth of thinking,

the number was brought down to 15. And finally 10 were chosen after another round of video interviews.

The incubation programme will start on September II in Bengaluru. N/Core is offering an innovation grant of Rs 10 lakh to each selected non-profit. They will be mentored by industry leaders, including Sanjay Purohit, exchairman of Infosys Consulting, Maneesh Dhir, former MD of Apple India and current partner of Social Venture Partners, K.R.Lakshminarayan, chief endowment officer of Azim Premii Foundation, and Ujwal Thakar, ex CEO of Pratham and GiveIndia. The batch is being supported by BookASmile, the charity initiative of Book-MyShow, Dr Reddy's Foundation, and philanthropists like Deep Kalra, founder, MakeMyTrip, among others.
